Bootcamp and Athletic training have one major thing in common. They are designed to take the natural human instincts that humans have, and retrain them - to replace human instinct with trained instinct. So that when the soldier is faced with a situation where it would be human nature to run and hide – He instead defends his position and his mates.

The athlete too – retrains her body so that when she stands at the start gate of her great race, she will instinctively excel far beyond the human average, when the starters pistol is fired. Both of these examples are of individuals who choose willfully, to commit their lives to something greater than themselves – believing that the hard work and the sacrifice is worth it in the end. Perhaps that is why the apostle Paul, so many times compares the Christian life, to an athletic race – or a soldier carrying armor.

A great illustration goes like this: Once upon a time there were two frogs and they both fell into a cream pitcher. One was an optimistic soul; but the other took a gloomy view of life. "We shall drown, he cried, without more ado. So with a last despairing cry he flung up his legs and said good bye

Quoth the other frog with a merry grin "I can't get out, but I won't give in". I'll just swim around until my strength is spent then I will die the more content. Bravely he swam until it would seem that his struggles began to turn the cream. On top of the butter, at last he stopped And out the bowl he gaily hopped

What of the moral, Tis easily found: If you can't hop out, keep swimming around.

Persistence and Perseverance – the act of keep on keeping on. The writer of Hebrews gives us two things to persevere for in the Chapter twelve of his epistle. First, he encourages us to divest ourselves of everything that hinders us and secondly, he warns us to abandon the sin that so easily entangles us.

The picture he is drawing for us is one of an athlete that is hampered by weight of sin tied around his ankles, by obstacles in his way – temptations and spiritual roadblocks, by distractions and even incomplete training.

Instead, he tells us that if we want to run the Christian race with success, we need to (Verse 2) 2 fixing our eyes on Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith. For the joy set before him he endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God.

Why should we look to Jesus for our inspiration to persevere? Because in verse 3 the writer of Hebrews tells us that Jesus endured much more spiritual opposition, endured earthly temptation, endured more hate, vitriol, aggression, persecution, humiliation than any of us gathered here this morning. And yet, he overcame it all.

Hebrews 12: 3 Consider him who endured such opposition from sinners, so that you will not grow weary and lose heart.

I want to leave you with the words of President Calvin Coolidge He said, Nothing in the world can take the place of perseverance and persistence. Talent will not – nothing is more common than unsuccessful individuals with talent. Genius will not – unrewarded genius is almost a proverb. Education will not; the world is full of educated derelicts. Perseverance and determination alone are omnipotent. If you're low on perseverance today – Take this time to rededicate yourself to the will of God and the Christian walk as he has called you to do.
