The children attend school year round with the exception of holiday breaks and summer in which the days are shortened.

Through generous donations by Mission 3:16 friends and partners, the students are provided with Bibles, textbooks, school supplies, uniforms, transportation, basic medical needs, and nourishing food. The children are currently housed in foster type homes until the completion of their new house at Beulahland. Mission 3:16 provides the majority of assistance for the children's primary needs.

BEULAHLAND

In 1991, Pastor Peter and Eunice purchased the original property for the children's home and school. The Lord gave him the name Beulahland taken from Isaiah 62:4. Mission 3:16 visited in 2006 and it was determined that more property was needed to complete the vision. After purchasing the additional property, the work at Beulahland continued. To date, the land, the first building, a 390 foot water well, the generator housing and two large generators are completely paid for by our friends and partners. Work on the security wall will continue as buildings are constructed.

January 2016 marked the celebration for the groundbreaking of Beulahland Children's Home and School. Pastor Peter has laid the cornerstone and construction is underway. This building will be a three story structure. The first level being the school, the second level being the children's housing and the third level being the staff housing. Through the grace of God, inspiring heartfelt prayers and generous donations will make this dream and vision a reality.

BEULAHLAND

Maternity & Nursing Home

Mission 3:16 leases the building where Pastor Peter's family home and Beulahland Maternity and Nursing Home are currently located. The medical clinic operates in the front and their home is located in the rear. Here we provide basic medical care for our children and staff. Prenatal and postnatal care is provided for women. Eunice is authorized to train, equip and certify student nurses who serve at our clinic. Many of these young ladies are being rescued from the deadly grip of human trafficking into the secure embrace of their loving Savior, Jesus Christ.

Each week Eunice and the student nurses travel to the finished building at Beulahland. They are getting hands on experience by providing basic medical care to men, women and children who come from the villages for treatment. This people group known as Edo people, whose culture goes back 4000 years, still practices ancestral worship and woodoo. While caring for their physical needs, our primary mission is to compel them out of the kingdom of darkness into the Kingdom of Light, as we lovingly share with them the Gospel of Jesus Christ.



OUTREACH TO HAITI



Sheldon and Tammy met Gladys Mercilus in Pastor Monoit (third from left) along with pastors from their church pastor New Covenant Church in

Haiti, near Port Au Prince, where they have been for nearly 35 years. Pastor Monoit oversees eleven pastors and seven churches. They have 3 schools with 250 children. They currently feed the children, in one school, four times per month. Their primary goal is to teach the children the Word of God. Pastor Monoit's desire is to have a school in every church.

The ministry also operates a medical clinic. Gladys is the director. The clinic has a doctor who visits the clinic each Saturday while Gladys, an assistant nurse and a local pastor work there daily.
