

ture is formed. It's fulfilling when we put in the last piece.

From time to time, our lives are like that. The pieces get dumped out of the box and scrambled, and we are tasked with reassembly. When the pieces of our lives land, we're fairly good at putting them together. Sometimes that is fun and exhilarating; other times it is difficult and emotionally draining. With God's help and direction, the pieces do come together, and a new normal is established.

We have walked with each other through the pieces of life. Sometimes a difficult precipitating event

scrambles our puzzle like a family issue, the passing of a loved one, a difficult diagnosis, school issues, or job pressures. We don't like that these events break through the illusion that we are in control of our lives. Other times happy events rearrange



the puzzle as we transition to a new phase of life; happy

events like graduation, marriage, a new baby, a promotion, or retirement.

We trust in Jesus who said, "Everyone who hears these words of mine and puts them into practice is like a wise man who built his house on the rock. The rain came down, the streams rose, and the winds blew and beat against that house; yet it did not fall, because it had its foundation on the rock." (Matthew 7:24-25)

Jesus is the steadfast rock through all the storms of life. Jesus is the picture on the front of the box to which we refer as we assemble the puzzle. He enables us to sing, "On Christ the solid rock I stand, all other ground is sinking sand."




