"Freedom!"

The iconic movie line comes from Braveheart, the story of 13th Century Scottish warrior William Wallace who led the Scots in the First War of Scottish Independence against King Edward I of England. Although the English army seems to be far superior, Wallace rallies the Scots to fight against them.

Gathering his troops, he says, "I see a whole army of my countrymen, here in defiance of tyranny! You have come to fight as free men. And free man you are! What will you do without freedom? Will you fight?"

A young soldier answers, "No, we will run and live!"

"Yes! Fight and you may die," Wallace replies. "Run and you will live at least awhile. And dying in your bed many years from now, would you be willing to trade all the days from this day to that for one chance, just one chance, to come back here as young men and tell our enemies that they may take our lives but they will never take our freedom!!!"

"Freedom!" is our fall teaching series based on Galatians.

Too often, Christianity is seen as "dos" and "don'ts" which prevent adherents from any kind of enjoyable and successful life. Paul teaches that although once bound by sin, we have been offered grace and life in Jesus Christ through His death and resurrection. We have been set free from the rules and rituals of the law to follow the Holy Spirit who leads us to love God and others. Through the freedom which He brings, we find life that really works.

Sin has a way of seducing us, addicting us, binding us. We inherit that nature from Adam. We think that the guilt and shame are part of the human condition with which we have to live. Paul lists the works of the flesh as "adultery, fornication, uncleanness, lewdness, idolatry, sorcery, hatred, contentions, jealousies, outbursts of wrath, selfish ambitions, dissensions, heresies, envy, murders, drunkenness, revelries, and the like" (Galatians 5:19-21). The good news is that Christ can break the bonds of sin.

Paul describes life in the spirit that bears fruit—"love, joy, peace, longsuffering, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control" (Galatians 5:22-23)—and allows us to love God and others.

The only way we find this life is in Christ. We live because we share His DNA and are heirs to all His promises. The only way to find freedom is to be bound to Jesus Christ. We give Jesus our lives and our freedom, and in exchange He makes us fully alive and gives us true freedom. That is good news worth celebrating.

We just need to be reliant upon Him. I have a tendency to rely on myself, but need to constantly remind myself to seek His guidance above all, because He knows so much more. Have you been relying on Him to guide you lately?
