



"I trust you'll treat him well"

[As school is starting this year, my heart has been drawn to an article written by Dan Valentine that I published in newsletters in September 1983, 1985, and 1988. Three special little boys began kindergarten in those years. Another special little boy will being to preschool at New Horizons Academy in Wauseon this year. . . .And there are a lot of special boys and girls starting a new school year.]

Dear World,

My young son starts to school today. It's going to be sort of strange and new to him for awhile, and I wish you would sort of treat him gently.

You see, up to now he's been king of the roost. He's been boss of the backyard. His mother has always been near to soothe his wounds and repair his feelings.

But now things are going to be different.

This morning, he's going to walk down the front steps, wave his hand, and start out on the great adventure. It is an adventure that might take him across continents, across oceans. It's an adventure that will probably include wars and tragedy and sorrow. To live his life in the world he will have to live in will require faith and love and courage.

So, World, I wish you would sort of look after him. Take him by the hand and teach him things he will have to know.

But do it gently, if you can.

He will have to learn, I know, that all men are not just, that all men are not true.

But teach him also that for every scoundrel there is a hero; that for every crooked politician there is a great and dedicated leader. Teach him that for every enemy, there is a friend.

It will take time, World, I know. But teach him, if you can, that a nickel earned is of far more value than a dollar found. Teach him to learn to lose so he'll enjoy winning that much more.

Steer him away from envy, if you can, and teach him the secret of guiet laughter.

Let him learn early that bullies are the easiest people to whip in the schoolyard. Teach him, if you can, the wonders of books. But also let him ponder the eternal mystery of birds on the wing, and bees in the sun, and flowers on a green hill.

In school, World, teach him it is far more honorable to fail that to cheat. Teach him to have faith in his own idea, even if everyone says they are wrong. Teach him to be gentle with gentle people and tough with tough people. Try to give my son the strength not to follow the crowd when everyone is getting on the bandwagon. Teach him to listen to all men—but teach him also to filter all he hears on a screen of truth and take just the good that siphons through.

Teach him, if you can, how to laugh when he's sad. Teach him there is no shame in tears. Teach him there can be glory in failure and despair in success.

Teach him to scoff at cynics and to beware of too much sweetness. Teach him to sell his brains and brawn to the highest bidder but never to put a price tag on his heart and soul.

Teach him how to close his ears to a howling mob, but to stand and fight if he thinks he's right.

Teach him there are times when a man must gamble. And there are times when a man must pass the dice.

Treat him gently, World, if you can, but don't coddle him. Because only the test of fire makes fine steel. Let him have the courage to be impatient. Let him have the patience to be brave.

Let him be no other man's man. Teach him always to have sublime faith in himself.

Because then he will always have sublime faith in mankind.

This is guite and order, World, but see what you can do. He's such a nice little fellow, my son!

Testimonies from Around the World Love Packages – June - July 2019

Ghana:

There was mass distribution of Christian literature, Bibles, books and tracts in the township and villages of Ejura. When Reverend Solomon received these materials from us, he said there is a mosque in every single community in Ejura.

After distributing hundreds of Christian literature in these Muslim communities, many of the Muslims became very angry and began to question what is this Christendom about, and who is this Jesus Christ. Then Reverend Solomon decided to pay for a radio interview to explain who Jesus Christ is and His mission on earth.

Steve, in my surprise last month, there was 23 Muslims who gave their lives to Christ and this month there are 36 in the number of Muslims who gave their lives to Jesus and has been baptized already.

Reverend Solomon is requesting more Bibles, books and other Christian literature to freely distribute among the whole township. I promised him we will be getting him more literature to save the lost. This is all possible because of the Love Packages. Blessings!

<u>India:</u>

I and my friend visited the book expo at Faith Prayer and Tract league for the first time. We took Sunday school class kits in bulk and then it was a great surprise for us when we came to know that there was no need to pay for them. Really it is a great help for us with the children. May abundant blessing be showered upon the good hearts that are giving these things and doing this ministry.

South Africa:

Hello! This is just a short thank you to let you know how your giving has impacted us here in Port Elizabeth, South Africa. My husband and I have been missionaries here for 16 of the last 20 years. Currently we are a part of the Potters House Church. One of our outreach ministries is to go to the local government hospital to visit those without visitors, share our testimonies, witness about Jesus, lead people in a sinner's prayer, pray for their healing. We found that we created a thirst for Dos word that we were unable to meet with meager finances. So, while in Capetown we found a free bookstore that had Christian material donated from our beloved USA! We took a box back and have been giving them to these new believers at the hospital! One whole room of patients last week received Jesus and were so grateful for the booklets that they asked me to take their picture and sent it to you.

Sometimes as Christians we give to needs and never know, "until that day" if they were of any use or were fruitful. This email is from my heart to let you know <u>YES</u>, your giving is fruitful and reaching around the world and we are benefiting from it! In the material there were some key rings with the Jesus story that our Sunday school teachers are using! Wow what a blessing! May God stir your hearts – do not grow weary for even now you are reaping a harvest in Africa through your good works! Thank you! Heather.

Zimbabwe:

I write to you expressing my joy and happiness for the books and Bible that you gave to me and my family. I could not afford to buy a Bible for my entire life, but God knew that one day I'll get one through you. Also, thank you for the books. When I got home with them, my husband was astonished and he promised me that he will come to church. Though he was a drunkard, he promised me that he will make it and he has. I'm so excited that God used these books and Bible to draw my family closer to him. Now I'm able to share the devotions with him and they are also uplifting my spirit. May the good Lord bless you for your good work. Amen.

HAITI MINISTRY UPDATE

For the past few years our Mission Team, along with other local churches, have been supporting Pastor Rayburn Sanon and his churches in Haiti.

Through his "Ministry Evangelical Christ for All" he provides basic needs to his congregation members such as school supplies (to allow each child to attend school), basic medical care at a local clinic and food, in the form of one complete meal per week for each congregation. Generous donations have also gone towards construction of a much needed roof on one of his two churches!



One of the main visions of this ministry has been the creation of a school at each location. Recent donations have enabled us to provide for benches, tables, chairs and blackboards to equip 3 classrooms at each location, Also, funds are in place for construction of kitchen and restroom facilities at each school!

Our prayer is that future donations will enable these schools to open this September! The current goal of \$2,000/month will provide for Principals, teachers, helpers, kitchen staff and food for these schools.

Please continue to pray for Pastor Rabrun, his family, and the Haitian people. God is alive and working in this country!
