I like instant gratification. Scott Peck wrote that one of the attributes of "The Road Less Traveled" is gratification delayment. The ability to plan long-term and to work toward a long-range goal is the road less traveled to maturity.

Paul encourages us with an agricultural analogy, "Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up." - Galatians 6:9 NIV

In our first meeting with a new family caseworker, she asked about our lives. I included a brief description of the church and some people she might know. In passing, I mentioned the Rock.

Her face lit up! "You do the Rock! Thank you for doing that ministry!"

Although she is not from Liberty Center, she hears lots of good things about the Rock. Some of the kids she knows really look forward to it. It makes a real difference in their lives, and for some it is a needed safe space for them to go. She said the ministry is really vital to the kids and community. While I like to see actions and results, ministry involves hard work and waiting. Have I mentioned that waiting is not my gift? At times, while I wait, I make a list of thing that I am waiting for—whining for. That is not very productive.

I would use my time better. . . . We would use our time better while we are waiting, if we study, pray, and serve. . . . and gather together at least weekly to encourage one another.

Many churches have money set aside for such a purpose, but I'd like to share what my family started 14 years ago, the Watkins Mission Scholarship Fund. This was started to honor my Grandparents, Richard and Evelyn Watkins. Throughout their life together, my grandparents served and led countless mission trips and loved getting others involved. So at my grandparents'

retirement, my mother and her siblings presented them with the gift of establishing a scholarship fund, a way to spread their love of missions to others. Anyone in the district or a local church participating in their first mission trip can apply for a scholarship through the Maumee Watershed District. When I decided to write about this I reached out to Rae Lynn Schleif, who helped my mother and Aunt establish this fund. Through her I was connected to Pastor Jeremiah Diegel, whose members received scholarship funds to go to Henderson KY in June. My family was invited to attend the service at Christ United Methodist Church, where the mission members shared their experiences. One expectation of receiving the scholarship, is that each recipient will share their testimony of their mission trip experience with a church group that they choose. It was a beautiful gift to hear from teenagers and adults who fell in love with serving God like this. They saw God in lessons learned through the work they did, in overcoming fears, and in meeting new friends. I could tell that everyone who went on the mission trip grew closer to God, a legacy for which my grandparents would be grateful. As someone who has long been "bitten" by the Mission bug, (it runs in the family) I was humbled and blessed to hear their stories. Anyone who has never been on a mission trip can apply for a scholarship. And anyone is welcome to contribute to the Watkins Mission Scholarship fund through the Maumee Watershed District.
