

Only God can make a tree. . . and a Christian

A couple days ago, I bought three trees with plans to plant them next week. This has initiated some cogitating about tree-planting and disciple-making.

Tree-planting certainly is not about instant gratification. Depending on the variety, shade trees need 25 to 50 years to reach maturity. Maybe in a few years, you can set your lawn chair under it and enjoy shade from the summer sun. Timber trees need 35 years until harvest. Fruit trees take at least a half dozen years before they even begin to bear. In our fast-food, fast-paced, 24-hour-news-cycle culture, who has time to wait for a tree to develop?

Disciple-making is not a quick process. While salvation may come in an instant, it takes a lifetime to grow a person to Christian maturity. There are ages and stages where spiritual formation proves its genuineness: A preschooler who loves Jesus. A young student who makes right behavioral choices. A teen who hangs with Christian friends. A young adult who continues their church relationships and spiritual formation. Newlyweds who make Christ the center of their home. Parents who rear their children in the faith. Empty nesters who learn and serve. Seniors who encourage others with the genuineness of a lifetime of faithful living. The growth toward Christian maturity takes a lifetime.

In my lifetime, I've planted trees for someone else to enjoy. Hurricane lke destroyed our beautiful Bradford Pear in our Miamisburg front yard. We planted a hardwood maple to take it's place. Six years later, when we moved, it was still a very young tree. I wonder if it is finally getting to the place where it provides shade for the people who bought our house. Maybe it won't mature until the next owners move in. In our culture, people are good at doing things that benefit themselves, but tree planting is something you often do for someone else.

Disciple-making is an other centered project. Joy is spelled Jesus first, Others second, Yourself last. The first counter-cultural task of spiritual formation is realizing that it is not about you. Your efforts in disciple-making are other centered. You help children learn the basics of the faith. You engage in service projects in your church and community and mission ventures around the world. You pool wisdom and offer encouragement in your circle of friends. The byproduct of your focus on Jesus and Others is your spiritual growth and satisfaction. You find joy!

Planting trees feels really good. They don't cost that much and they are good for our planet. We should do it more often. As I listen to the birds nesting, as I see the leaves budding, as I see the flowers blooming, as I see the colors turning, I see their masterful Creator. God has created a beautiful world. Whatever part I play in enhancing His creation blesses Him and blesses me.

Disciple-making feels really good. When children enthusiastically sing "Jesus loves me", when students discover the pure joy that comes from serving people they don't know, when Christians walk down the aisle and pledge a lifetime of love and faithfulness, when new parents bring their children to church and to the Lord, when empty-nesters and senior pitch in to help the generation behind them grow, when saints leave this world to the next better world, disciple-making feels really good. It's a real blessing. We should do it more often. We will do it this week.
