## CAMP BELAHALAND FOUNDATION AND ORPHANAGE HOME REPORT

To God be the glory great things he hath done. The main building houses as a dormitory for the boys and the girls including staff quarters have taken off the ground. We had an initial drawback because we had to solidify the felling of the old dugout wells being used by the old settlers in the village, in order to withstand the pressure of a high rise building. The building is going to be L shaped.

We have also sand filled a large part of the roads we caved out so as direct them free of water to the main road. This we have to do when the dump trucks were sinking most of the time on the building site.

### WHERE WE ARE NOW

We have gotten to the first level, we have gotten some gravel, sand and rod. What we have on ground is almost one quarter of the needed sand and gravel. What are in short supply are cement and iron rod, for the needed quantity to start the decking of the first floor and to do German flooring of basement.

We are making appeal that our friends and partners to rally round us so that we can start off by December or latest January during the dry season when rains will not disturb (for we have eight months of rains).

### THE CHILDREN AND PROGRESS

We have every cause to thank the Lord because so far this year our kids did not suffer so much when we had an epidemic of whooping cough. We had our usual share of malaria and typhoid attacks. Thank God for the clinic staff. One of our staff Sis. Favour have just give birth to a brand new baby.



Children are kept happy and excited by celebrations and parties. We do have enough of these as follows: Christmas, New year, Easter, Children National Day, Graduation in summer and National Independence day. We have always fed triple the numbers of children in our care-most from the streets, WHILE YOUR CHILDREN FIGHT OVER TOYS, OUR FIGHT OVER FOOD.

### MEDICAL CLINIC

Early this year, we lost sister Juliet, the second assistant nurse. Her death was so sudden and painful. The second nurse Ebony is married and recently she is expecting. We are still looking for a replacement for sis Juliet. We had a delivery which was breached, but the baby arrived safety. We are presently preparing to carryout BP and sugar test for the villagers

### EUNICE HEALTH

Her major problem was the kidney failure she was having. Now she is responding very fast to treatment. The doctor has advised on the regulation of salt and other recommended diet. All in all, we give God all the Glory!
